PAINTING PROCEDURE if Installing Primed Spoiler Only

- We recommend you to have the painting performed at an authorised Mitsubishi Motors dealer.
- 1) Lightly scuff the exterior surface of the primed spoiler with a scotch-bright pad.
- 2) Use a solvent wipe, like Prepsol or Isopropyl Alcohol, to clean the spoiler before spray painting.
- 3) Use the vehicles paint code to colour match the paint.
- 4) Mask the threaded mounting holes & Stud threads of the Spoiler.
- 5) Spray paint the spoiler.



Caution⁻


Oven baking is allowed.

To prevent damage to the spoiler, do not exceed 60°C.

- 6) When the spoiler is dry, check for painting defects. Correct as necessary.
- Check the 2 drainage holes at the bottom and both outside edges of the spoiler, is free of paint. Unblock if required.
- 8) Remove the masking from the mounting threaded holes and Stud threads.
- 9) Confirm the final spoiler paint colour matches the vehicle colour. Correct as necessary.

INSTALLATION PROCEDURES

A. REMOVING TRUNK LID TRIM (if fitted)



This procedure is only applicable for vehicles fitted with trunk trim.



Caution

The removed parts will be reused for reassembly. Do not lose them.

- Open the trunk lid.
 If handle is fitted, remove the screws and remove the handle. (note: not all models will have this handle fitted)
- Remove all of the trim clips using a trim remover tool. Remove trunk trim.



Note

When replacing the trim after the spoiler is fitted, ensure the 2 larger trim clips are inserted into the original location in the centre of the trim.
